FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Parents/Guardians

Covid-19 and School Procedures

◆ Assemblies, School Masses, School Community Events, Excursions/ Incursions

All of these activities will not recommence until further advice is received from the Department of Health. Please note that parents can still access the assemblies through Zoom. Details will be sent via text messages.

♦ School Boards, Parents and Friends

May resume after school hours for up to 20 people where physical distancing and enhanced cleaning and hygiene protocols are observed.

◆ Parent and Caregiver Meetings

Pre-arranged meetings with parents and caregivers are permitted for purposes of new enrolments, pastoral care case management, student behaviour and engagement, medical reasons and other emergencies.

♦ School Visitors

Visitors to St Cecilia's will be limited to essential health, wellbeing, case management and maintenance providers, and occur only when the school can assure adherence to physical distancing requirements and enhanced cleaning requirements.

♦ If a Child is Unwell

Unwell students should stay at home. Parents are asked to seek medical advice if their child exhibits symptoms of COVID-19. Standard processes for advising the school of a child's absence will apply.

◆ Semester One Reporting

School systems and sectors across the country have been offered flexibility concerning reporting for Semester One, 2020. Catholic Education Western Australia is in the process of addressing this and parents will be notified as soon as these changes have been confirmed.

Health and Hygiene

The health, safety and wellbeing of students and staff remain our highest priority. Additional cleaning measures already in place in our school will be sustained. Unwell students are to stay at home until they receive medical clearance to attend school.

♦ Physical distancing

While physical distancing is not required for students in schools, we will actively encourage our students to do so wherever practical. Physical distancing is still a requirement for all adults.

◆ Parent and Caregiver Access

Parents and caregivers should be advised that they are not permitted to exit their vehicles when dropping off or collecting their children. If parents and caregivers are walking their children to and from school, they should undertake their drop-off or pick-up at the school gates. If you are dropping your children off to school after the bell or picking up early, please contact the office and a member of the administration team will meet you in the drive through lane.

♦ Personal Hygiene

Arrangements are in place for regular and thorough hand-washing for students and staff.

♦ Liturgy in Schools

Liturgies and class Masses will not recommence until further advice is received.

♦ Remaining Prepared

St Cecilia's will continue to review and respond to cleaning and hygiene protocols in line with advice from the Department of Health. In the event of a confirmed case of COVID-19, any temporary school closure will be advised by the Department of Health and the school will enact its Six Step Response Plan in the event of a confirmed case.

Out of School Hours Care

Based on the last survey, we did not have the number of participants to make it viable for One Tree. Once things return to normal we can try again. Please see below the information from the survey One Tree collected:

... the figures for any of the services were just not enough for the service to be viable. Before school needs on any given day were a maximum of 2 children. After school care needs again on any given day were a maximum of 11 children and this was only on a Wednesday, the remainder of the week was a maximum of 6 children per day. Vacation care on any given day was a maximum of 4 children and again this was only for Wednesday with the remainder of the week at 3 children per day.

Pentecost

Sunday 31 May is Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost, meaning 'the fiftieth day', is celebrated fifty days after Easter. It is to remember to coming of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles and other followers of Jesus as described in the book of Acts in the New Testament and as Jesus had promised after he rose from the dead. In Year One and Year Two, we have been discussing Pentecost as being the 'birthday of the Church' as it



was on this day that the Church's mission to the world began. If you are able to attend Mass on Pentecost Sunday, look out for the red robes worn by the priests as a symbol of the flames in which the Holy Spirit came to earth. Other symbols you may see include a white dove and wind to symbolise the breath of God.

First Holy Communion and Confirmation

This term should have been a busy one for our students making preparations for the Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation, but these preparations have been impacted by Covid-19 restrictions.

While the easing of some restrictions has meant that Father Edward is able to invite parishioners to weekend Masses once again, we are still awaiting confirmation of a new date for both of these Sacraments.

We will communicate the updated information and program dates as soon as we can.

National Reconciliation Week

Next week is National Reconciliation Week. National Reconciliation Week is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. The dates for National Reconciliation Week, 27 May to 03 June, are the same each year and commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey – the successful 1967 referendum and Hight Court Mabo decision.

The theme for National Reconciliation Week this year is "In this Together". Reconciliation Australia had no idea how much this theme would resonate not just around Australia but the world when they announced the theme last year. Their view is that regardless of the situation, be it crisis or reconciliation, we *are* all in this together.


The Term 1 Swimming Carnival was our last whole school gathering prior to restrictions being put in place. It was
